



The difference between the distinctive home and the commonplace dwelling is purely a matter of design. By a few discreet decorative touches this house has been given a most pleasing appearance. The arrangement of the first floor rooms is unusual and well adapted for entertaining. On the second floor the rooms are exceptionally large, well ventilated and with direct bath connection.





Essential Information

HERE are 100 designs, published with the view of assisting the prospective home-builder in selecting a plan that will meet his individual requirements. In each is combined artistic beauty in appearance, convenience and utility in arrangement, and practical economy in construction.

If one of the designs herein shown does not exactly fit your needs, \$2.00 will bring you a copy of "Brick and Colonial Homes," illustrating 85 additional designs of a similar character to those shown in this book.

STOCK PLANS

The idea of publishing house designs, so that the builder in the small town may have a home in as good taste as his city brother, has always appealed to me. I started the mail order part of my business when I published my first plan book in 1914. This is my third large plan book and I think by far the best. The books have given prospective home builders photos and plans in such a way that they could select a design. The houses shown are not copies of other Architect's work, I have personally designed each house. To enable me to present a wide variety of ideas I have visited numerous cities from the Atlantic to the Pacific, always with my kodak and sketch pad along; I have bought every magazine and plan book I could hear of, therefore I feel that I am able to give you an interesting selection of ideal home designs for the present day. Being a woman I feel that I know the little things that should go in it to make living in the house a pleasure to the entire family. On the plans the room sizes indicate inside measurements. In this book I have also shown the area of each house; this will be of service in comparing the sizes of the houses. Also, I have had the floor plans reduced in the same proportion so, even at a glance, you can sometimes tell which design will be the most economical. The price I ask for these stock plans is far below their value if I sold but one copy, but by selling many of each design, you get a plan drawn with all the care of a special design at a greatly reduced price.

REVERSE PLANS

This means that all rooms, porches, etc., shown on the left will be on the right, and all on the right will be on the left; everything is reversed. Plans are redrawn so that the lettering reads correctly. Note that plans can be reversed when looking over designs as sometimes the reversed plan will be "just the one" when the plan as shown would not do at all.

CONSTRUCTION COSTS

In a book that is to be given distribution through a wide territory it is impossible to give different information regarding the cost of building. Costs are different in the various sections, in city and smaller town, therefore cost figures given here would be misleading. I have given the area of each house. Get your contractor to give you the local cost per square foot for such a house as you desire, and in that way you can get a fair estimate of the cost. The only accurate way is to get the working plans and have your contractor make a bid; no architect has the right to say for what price a contractor will build a particular house. If the cost runs too high the plan will be exchanged within two weeks of date order was shipped for one that will cost less.

SPECIAL PLANS

Sometimes slight changes are desired. If you have a good contractor the changes may be marked on the blue-print and you can use the stock plan. However, if the changes wanted are extensive, complicated or you want something entirely different it will be necessary to have new plans drawn. Absolutely no changes will be made on the stock plans; do not ask it.

I take special pride in my new plans, draw every line myself, therefore I can take orders for only a limited number of such plans. My idea is, not how many I can furnish, but how good I can make those that I do furnish. As to the cost of new plans, no plans are drawn entirely new or redrawn for less than \$100, usually the price is four times the cost of a stock plan of similiar size and construction. For such plans the lumber and mill list is \$25. You are furnished with three copies of everything.

For special plans pencil sketches are sent you for your criticism and correction, the final plans are not completed until sketches meet your approval. For special plans a check for \$50 must accompany all orders, balance to be paid upon completion of plans.

LUMBER AND MILL LISTS

The lumber and mill list is particularly useful where you wish to saw your framing before you begin to buy other material. The lists also assure you that all supply men are figuring upon the same quality and amounts. The lists give the size, length and number of pieces of all framing, also the size and quantity of all mill work such as doors, windows, ficoring, laths, built-in features, etc.

WHAT PLANS INCLUDE


The plans are practical working drawings, made to a scale of one-fourth inch to the foot and furnished in blue-pri it form. They cover foundation, floor and roof plans, four exterior elevations (and to a larger scale) details of exterior mill work and interior built-in features. The specifications are particularly prepared for each house, supplement the drawings, and cover masonry, plastering, carpentry, hardware, electric work, screens, plumbing, heating, metal work, painting, etc.


PAYMENT

Money order or personal check should accompany all orders for ready drawn plans. No plans will be sent with bill for same. If preferable, plans will be sent by express C. O. D. with privilege of examination. There are no discounts or commissions allowed on plans to anyone.

This is a fine type of the modern Colonial architecture, a home equally appropriate for the man who wishes a substantial city residence or for the farmer who feels able to give his family the same comforts and advantages as his city brother. The exterior is without any frills, depending upon its simple mass, well placed openings, good proportions and color scheme for beauty of design. The wide front terrace, porte cochere and large living porch will appeal to those who love the open.

The main rooms occupy the entire front of the house, leaving the library more private as a family sitting or bed room. The side hall, private stair and large breakfast room will be appreciated where there are children. The second floor has four bed rooms besides the very large sleeping porch. The sewing room could be used for a maid if need be. The rear balcony will prove useful for sunning purposes. Each bed room has direct connection with a bath.

In the basement there is provision for the steam heating plant.




FLOOR PLAN
